Minutes for FVEAA meeting held on April 22, 2006 at Clow Airport in Bolingbrook. President Ted Lowe called the meeting to order and first asked Rich Rezny our guest to introduce himself. Rich said he was former member in late 80's and has a Ford Ranger he might want to convert. Ted skipped the minutes and the treasurer's report, but that is okay because he has been doing so much stuff for the event and the club. Ted did talk about the business cards he generously designed and created at \$5.95 for 250 . Also Ted found shirts for \$16.50 nine dollars under budget, and if that is not enough, Ted made DVDs of Monster Garage episode for \$1.00. Thanks Again Ted.

Ted went over the advertisers including KTA, Rudman, Hartel Family, and others. At present we have almost \$2,000 committed for ads, but only \$250 in hand. All advertising is due by Wednesday April 26th. Sponsorship can be given through out the event and exhibit space is available up until the day of the event. Rich Hirschberg made a special appeal to get as many newspapers, radio, email servers, and email lists in your area to contact for articles, sound bites and web links.

John Emde spoke on batteries needing to be strapped down with heavy duty strapping, no rubber bungee cords. John also illustrated the track areas, whereby we come in off route 53 to enter the track and get into the pit area. John laid out the possible areas for our vehicles as well as the lighting system rules for drag strip racing. Driver must have a valid drivers license to drive on the track and no passengers are allowed. If the vehicle is a bicycle or motorcycle the driver must wear a motorcycle helmet. Drivers of street legal cars going less than 100mph do not have to wear a helmet.

Just before intermission, Ted challenged the members to think of design ideas for his new truck bed tilting. The design challenge involved abandoning the old gas-spring lifts in favor of using recycled garage door torsion springs, pulleys and cable. It appeared that Steve Grusha's cookies and Ken Simmermon's juice won out over people designing Ted's lift, but we will see the new design May 13th for the expo. The intermission went on until the meeting was adjourned about 11:30pm.


EV Racing Rules and Inspections Details

If you plan on racing your EV on the Route 66 Raceway drag strip (if for no other reason than a photo-op), you must follow these rules!

- No hubcaps
- All batteries must be strongly strapped down (no bungy cords)
- No passengers
- Motorcycles and e-bike riders must wear a helmet.
- Must have a valid drivers license

Drag Strip Timing and Scoring System Layout



PRE-STAGED BEAM:

An infrared beam sender/receiver connection (per lane) triggers pre-staged lights and signals drivers that they are close to "staging" when this beam is broken by vehicle's front wheel.

STAGED BEAM/STARTING LINE:

This infrared beam sender/receiver connection controls the starting and timing of each race. This beam triggers an independent "lane timer" for elapsed time and will trigger the red foul light if a false start occurs. A race cannot be started until both competitors are fully "staged." The staged beam is 6 inches past the pre-staged beam.

INTERVAL TIMERS:


Time and speed are recorded at five intervals along the track. There are clocking devices at the 60-foot, 330-foot, 1/8-mile, 1,000-foot and 1/4-mile locations.

SPEED TRAPS AND ELAPSED-TIME CLOCK BEAMS:

The first of these infrared beam sender/receiver triggers is located 66 feet before the finish line and is used to start the individual lane top speed clocks. A second beam, located at the finish line, shuts off both the individual lane elapsed-time and top speed clocks, and triggers the win indicator. The 66-foot speed trap com-putes top speed.

The length of the actual racing surface at an NHRA Drag Racing Series event is one-quarter mile, or 1,320 feet. The average width of each lane is 30 feet.

NHRA National Event 'Christmas Tree' Starting Line System



FULL TREE: Used in Competition, Super Stock and Stock, for which a handicap starting system is used to equalize competition. The three amber bulbs on the Christmas Tree flash consecutively fivetenths of a second apart, followed five-tenths later by the green starting light. A perfect reaction time on a full Tree is .500.

PRE-STAGE INDICATOR LIGHTS: Yellow bulbs warn drivers that they are approaching the starting line and the "staged" position.

STAGE INDICATOR LIGHTS: Signal drivers that they are on the starting line and ready for a run. These yellow bulbs come on when the front wheels of the race car interrupt the beam from a light source to the photo cells. These same photo cells start the timing equipment.


THREE AMBER STARTING SYSTEM: All three amber floodlights in a driver's lane flash

simultaneously before the green light comes on. This is called a "pro start" system. Racers running in handicap categories get a countdown of one amber light at a time until the green light comes on. The "pro start" system runs with a .4-second difference between the amber and green lights, while the handicap system runs with a .5-second difference between bulbs. Many non-national event tracks still use a five-amber light.

GREEN LIGHT: This is the one that makes it all happen. Once the green light is flashed, the driver in that lane is free to make a run down the track. Any time green light is shown in a driver's lane it indicates that a fair start was accomplished.

RED LIGHT: When a car leaves the starting line before the green light comes on, or, in some cases, is staged too deeply into the staging beams, the red light will flash in that lane. It indicates the driver in that lane has been disqualified. During competition, only one red light will light, thus eliminating only the first offender.
