


Meeting: Friday, June 15th

# Meeting Minutes

Meeting May 18, 2007 - at Clow International Airport

Call to order: 8:05. Attendance Sheet was passed around.

Ted Lowe introduced himself. We started with intros of people present. Each told where they were from and their EV interest. A record number of 78 people were present (and 85 by the end of the meeting)!

The minutes were approved as printed with a note about correcting the August 11 and 12 dates.

The Treasurer's Report was presented by Dale Corel. This showed a checking balance of \$1047.90 and a savings balance of \$5326.56.

Ed Meyer introduced Dr. Packer of the Packer Wings organization. Dr. Packer briefly discussed the Packer Wings new project of attempting to win the \$2 million prize for being the first group to produce an electric powered airplane capable of carrying a person in a one mile flight. Packer Wings is a excellent group that raises money for their widespread philanthropic activities.

Upcoming Events included the May 19 event in Oswego, the May 19 event in Lockport, and the WKTEC showing at the Elgin Library on 6/28.

Midwest Alternative Fuel Expo brochures were handed out to new people.

A short discussion was held on a new meeting site, but nothing was certain at that time.

Avcon charging stations have been installed in Aurora in the Illinois 25 Commuter parking lot, and an inquiry has come from the Elgin library. It was noted that these would require a 40 amp 220 supply, and an installation by licensed electricians.

We are working on a possible new meeting location, hoping to find something more centrally located. Lewis University has offered us their large meeting room, a 300 person theater on Route 53 in Romeoville.

Rich H. again reminded all of the Midwest Alternative Fuel Vehicle Expo in August, which is part of the Illinois Renewable Energy Fair. This will be at the Ogle County Fairgrounds and will feature hybrid guru Chris Schneider, and seminars on biodiesel. A fuel cell car from IIT is scheduled to be there.

It was mentioned that Ray DeBoth's son has ordered a Tesla

After some discussion, Honorary Membership would not be offered at this time. However, there was discussion about Business memberships, which would be offered at \$100, \$250 and \$500. We initially thought we would approach Zap!, Pioneer, and Excelon. This money is not yet tax deductable.

Raffle took place netting \$52. (last month was \$22) We raffled off one issue of "Solar Today" and several seperate bumper stickers.

Three speakers made presentations after the break.

First we showed a short program on the making of the "Little Juice Coupe" segment aired on WGN as John Jeide took the first drive in his newly converted EV.

Todd Dore shared several experiences with his plug in hybrid, including graphs of his data. Todd certainly keeps accurate data for his conversion, and is able to present it in an understandable manner.

John Emde finished the discussion with a talk on electric motors, types, and availability.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:31





### EV's in the News

The Alliance for Automobile Manufacturers, an industry group comprised of many of the large car makers, are objecting to the newly proposed CAFE standards. The Alliance of Automobile Manufacturers is a trade association of 9 car and light truck manufacturers including BMW Group, DaimlerChrysler, Ford Motor Company, General Motors, Mazda, Mitsubishi Motors, Porsche, Toyota and Volkswagen. These new proposed standards are a hot topic in Washington lately, but the Alliance is launching newspaper ads (full page) and broadcast spots on Radio to encourage voters to tell their representatives not to pass this legislation. CAFE (Corporate Average Fuel Economy) standards have not been moved in many years, but the Alliance feels that they should not be moved now.

Toyota has announced a dramatic increase in the numbr of Priuses sold in May 2007 tripling the prior number. That's a 196% increase. Comparing similar numbers showed the Camry up 16% and the Honda's Civic line up 53%. When Toyota testified at the California ARB meetings in San Diego, they said the Prius is now outselling the Camry in Washington state.

General Motors has annonced that has awarded two contracts to companies that will make the lithium-ion batteries it needs for its "E-Flex" hybrid drivetrain to enter production. The "E-Flex" powertrain announced by GM uses batteries for propulsion, and has several versions to regenerate power for the batteries.

Currently discussed are small gasoline engines, small diesel engines, or hydrogen powered fuel cell versions. This new powertrain was premiered at the Chicago Auto Show in the concept car the Chevy Volt. While the choice of powertrain(s) seems to be as yet undecided, Chevy appears to be preceding with the EV concept in contracting these two companies to provide needed batteries. The companies are Compact Power, Inc and Continental Automotive Systems. Compact Power is a part of LG Chem. GM appears to be pursing the Lithium-ion front, although some of the recent shipments from the far east have demonstrated reliability concerns if the battery packs are not high quality.

Likely the most telling quote is from GM Chariman Rich Wagoner, who said, "Given the huge potential that the Volt and its E-Flex system offers to lower oil consumption, lower oil imports, and reduce carbon emissions, this is a top priority program for GM."
