FVEAA Meeting Minutes

The September 19, 2008 FVEAA meeting was called to order at 7:12 by Ted Lowe, President.

Attendees who were at their first meeting or past members who had not been a member in more than a year introduced themselves, including several from Southern Illinois and from Wisconsin. About 70 people attended.

Ted showed many recent news clippings which had been published in the last month. He also discussed newsletters from the national EAAEV and other environmentally conscious groups. Ted also presented several reference materials, and urged all to become aware to what was available. If there are many copies of an item, taking the item was encouraged. If there was only one copy, guests were invited to look at the resource in detail to see if it was something they may want to order for themselves.

Elections:

Three needed to be elected from these four, and Rich, Ted, and Ken were chosen. The officer nominations were announced as:

Committee Reports:

Tech - no report. Outreach - Rich Hirschberg discussed the upcoming shows in West Elgin on October 4 and in Sugar Grove on October 18. The Sugar Grove show will be the Waubansee Environmental Fair. Also discussed was the November 8 energy show in Schaumburg. The recent car show at Elgin was discussed, and it was apparent that there was a lot of interest in alternative fuel vehicles. Legislative Affairs - no report. Charging Infrastructure - Todd Martin discussed several points in the report of the Charging Infrastructure Committee. He is trying to get Commonwealth Edison to come out to explain how dirty chargers affect the Edison Company, and why the "smart chargers" are more friendly to their equipment. At a recent meeting there was discussion of a project where an EV is built, were ComEd could supply the parts, and FVEAA would supply the labor. Stay tuned on more ComEd/FVEAA news.

New Business: There was a presentation by the Environmental Law and Policy Center, and a discussion of some unfinished legislation. There was a motion to add FVEAA to the list of supporters of ICAN. (Illinois Climate Action Network) This was approved by acclamation.

The meeting was finished with two presentations, the first from Ted Lowe, on making good quality large battery cables (like 2/0).



Proposed Bylaws Changes

These proposed changes are announced here and will be voted on at the November meeting.

Remove Reference to Special Meeting

The concept of 'Special Meetings' was removed by the previous amendments, but a reference was not removed.

Newsletter Publishing Schedule Change

Current wording: Article III - C. NOTIFICATION All current members shall be notified by mail of each Annual, Regular and Special Meeting by the Secretary, or the Secretary's agent, at least one week prior to the meeting.

Proposed wording: Current members shall be notified of meetings no less than 4 days before the meeting.

Rationale: The FVEAA Newsletter is our vehicle to notify members of upcoming meetings. Try as we might, we have consistently not met the 'at least one week' bylaw. This would require publishing the newsletter by Friday 7pm on the 2nd Friday of each month. This is a reasonable schedule for a retired

person, but is very difficult for people with regular jobs. Changing to the schedule to 'no less than 4 days' will allow publishing after a weekend of production and still allow time for the (diminishing number of) postal mailed newsletters to arrive in member's mailboxes before the meeting. The overwhelming majority of newsletters are distributed electronically now (210 to 48) which are instantly distributed.

Rewording Article II: Committees

Current wording: A. STANDING COMMITTEES This Corporation shall not have standing committees. B. SPECIAL COMMITTEES The President shall appoint special committees and their chairmen as needs arise.

C. COMMITTEE VACANCIES Vacancies on shall be filled immediately by presidential appointment.

Proposed wording: A. COMMITTEES This Corporation has committees as required to organize and perform FVEAA activities.

- B. COMMITTEE MANAGEMENT The President shall create and dissolve committees as necessary and apoint their chairmen.
- C. COMMITTEE VACANCIES Chairmen vacancies shall be filled promptly by presidential appointment.

Rationale: We do have committees now which are making progress in distributing responsibility and activities to a wider group of members increasing our ability to perform our mission. There is no longer a distinction between a special or standing committee.




FVEAAer Location Mapper Application

Chrysler Announces Four Plug-in Electric Vehicles

Chrysler has already produced over 38000 Gem NEVs (Neighborhood Electric Vehicles). The Gem is produced in six different models. They plan to produce one of the three following plug-in EVs by the end of 2010:

- 1. The Dodge EV which is an all electric drive with lithium batteries with a range of 150 to 200 miles. This is classified as a sports vehicle.
- 2. A four door Jeep extended range vehicle also using lithium batteries with the first 40 miles on electricity only and an extended range of 400 miles using a generator driven by an electric motor furnishing the power for the electric motor.

3. A Town and Country extended range EV with the same range as the Jeep EV.

ELPC Campaign for Illinois Clean Cars Act

The Environmental Law & Policy Center of the Midwest (ELPC) is currently working on a campaign to bring Clean Cars to Illinois. Illinois has the opportunity to become the 15th state to pass legislation that will ensure all new passenger vehicle and light-duty trucks will be more efficient and emit lower levels of air pollutants. This change will improve public health, save Illinois consumers money at the gas pump and help in the fight against global warming. The Illinois Clean Cars Act is coming up for vote in the Illinois House of Representatives this November, as House Bill 3424. The Act will raise the average fuel efficiency standard for new vehicles sold in the state to 39.6 mpg. ELPC is asking constituents to contact their Illinois House Representative to tell them to vote YES for this bill. Clean Car Organizers will be present at the September 19 monthly meeting to give a presentation about the bill and get petitions signed in support of bringing clean cars to Illinois. 


